

Hanging Instructions for Wallpaper

Standard Non-Woven

(untrimmed)

1. Surface Preparation

 Apply a high-quality acrylic primer to the surface before applying adhesive. Allow the primer to dry thoroughly for optimal results.

2. Preparing Wallpaper

- Use the following tools for precise cutting:
 - A large table
 - A long, rigid metal ruler
 - A cutter and fresh cutting blades
- Cut the white margins very straight to ensure perfect, almost invisible joints. Be careful not to scratch the wallpaper surface during manipulation of the large panels.

3. Handling Dark Colors

• For very dark wallpaper, apply a matching dark color along the edges of the paper with a thin brush. This prevents visible white seams after hanging.

4. Waterproofing (optional)

- Waterproofing can be applied before hanging the wallpaper.
- Recommended product: <u>Polyvine Decorators' Varnish Dead Flat Finish</u>. This clear, matte varnish should be sprayed on in one or two coats before hanging.

5. Hanging Standard Non-Woven Wallpaper

- This wallpaper, noted for its rigidity and pleasant texture, is easy to hang.
- Apply adhesive only to the wall, not to the wallpaper. Select an adhesive specifically designed for non-woven wallpaper.
- Avoid getting adhesive on the printed surface. If adhesive contacts the surface, gently dab it off with a dry cloth and allow it to dry.

6. Smoothing the Wallpaper

Use a flat brush or a heavy rubber roller to smooth the wallpaper onto the wall. Avoid using plastic scrapers, as they
may damage the printed surface.

7. Joining Panels

 While the adhesive is still wet, push the edges of two connecting panels together to eliminate visible seams. Proper hanging should result in completely undetectable seams.
